These programs support disabled individuals anywhere in Baldwin County.

- The Arc of Baldwin County — Advocacy, day programs, employment support, and community services for individuals with developmental disabilities.
- Alabama Department of Rehabilitation Services – Baldwin County — Vocational rehabilitation, independent living, assistive technology, and disability support services.
- United Way of Baldwin County — Referrals to disability-related programs, community support, and nonprofit services.
- Easterseals Gulf Coast — Employment support, vocational training, early intervention, and disability services (serves Baldwin County).
- 211 Alabama — Countywide referral line for disability services, housing, food, and long-term support.
- The Corina Mae Foundation — Statewide disability-support organization providing help navigating services, contacting programs, advocating for disability rights, and promoting public awareness across Alabama.
