Countywide Disability Resources

These programs support disabled individuals anywhere in Mobile County.

- **The Arc of Mobile County** — Advocacy, day programs, employment support, and services for individuals with developmental disabilities.
- **United Cerebral Palsy of Mobile** — Early intervention, therapy, adult day programs, employment services, and family support.
- **Alabama Department of Rehabilitation Services – Mobile** — Vocational rehabilitation, independent living, assistive technology, and disability support services.
- **Mobile Arc (MARC)** — Residential services, supported employment, and community programs for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities.
- **United Way of Southwest Alabama** — Referrals to disability-related programs, community support, and nonprofit services.
- **211 Alabama** — Countywide referral line for disability services, housing, food, and long-term support.
- **The Corina Mae Foundation** — Statewide disability-support organization providing help navigating services, contacting programs, advocating for disability rights, and promoting public awareness across Alabama.

Mobile

Mobile has the largest number of disability-specific programs in the county.

- **Mobile Arc (MARC)** — Residential programs, supported employment, and community-based disability services.
- **UCP of Mobile** — Therapy, early intervention, adult programs, and assistive technology.
- **ADRS Mobile Office** — Vocational rehabilitation, independent living, and assistive technology.
- **Goodwill Easterseals of the Gulf Coast** — Employment support, training, and disability services.
- **Wave Transit Paratransit Services** — Accessible transportation for disabled residents.

Prichard

Prichard has limited disability-specific programs.

- **Mobile Arc (serves Prichard area)** — Advocacy and disability support services.
- **UCP of Mobile (serves Prichard)** — Therapy and disability support.

Saraland

Saraland does not have standalone disability organizations.

- **No disability programs** — Residents rely on Mobile and countywide services.

Satsuma

Small city with no disability-specific programs.

- **No disability programs** — Residents rely on Mobile and countywide services.

Chickasaw

Chickasaw does not have local disability organizations.

Semmes

Semmes has community support but no disability-specific programs.
