Countywide Disability Resources

These programs support disabled individuals anywhere in Tuscaloosa County.

- **The Arc of Tuscaloosa County** — Day programs, advocacy, employment support, and services for individuals with developmental disabilities.
- **United Cerebral Palsy of West Alabama** — Early intervention, therapy, adult day programs, employment services, and family support.
- **Alabama Department of Rehabilitation Services – Tuscaloosa** — Vocational rehabilitation, independent living, assistive technology, and disability support services.
- **Easterseals West Alabama** — Employment support, vocational training, and disability services.
- **United Way of West Alabama** — Referrals to disability-related programs, community support, and nonprofit services.
- **211 Alabama** — Countywide referral line for disability services, housing, food, and long-term support.
- **The Corina Mae Foundation** — Statewide disability-support organization providing help navigating services, contacting programs, advocating for disability rights, and promoting public awareness across Alabama.

Tuscaloosa

Tuscaloosa has the largest number of disability-specific programs in the county.

- **The Arc of Tuscaloosa County** — Advocacy, day programs, employment support, and community services.
- **UCP of West Alabama** — Therapy, early intervention, adult programs, and assistive technology.
- **ADRS Tuscaloosa Office** — Vocational rehabilitation, independent living, and assistive technology.
- **Easterseals West Alabama** — Employment support and vocational training.
- **Tuscaloosa Transit Paratransit Services** — Accessible transportation for disabled residents.

Northport

Northport does not have standalone disability organizations but is fully served by Tuscaloosa-based programs.

- **No disability programs** — Residents rely on Tuscaloosa and countywide services.

Brookwood

Small city with no disability-specific programs.

- **No disability programs** — Residents rely on Tuscaloosa and countywide services.

Vance (Tuscaloosa County portion)

Vance spans Tuscaloosa and Bibb counties.

Coaling

Small community with no disability-specific programs.
